

ACTIVE STATES


The President signed a religious freedom executive order and 13 state legislatures passed religious freedom bills. The Supreme Court decided in favor of religious freedom in the Trinity Lutheran case, and it will hear another crucial case, Masterpiece Cakeshop, Ltd. v. Colorado Civil Rights Commission, this fall. 1AP continues to focus on states with year-long legislatures while also evaluating other states to prepare for the 2018 session.

Further Details

RFRA

Religious Freedom Restoration Acts balance the rights of religious individuals and institutions with the interests of the state.

MARRIAGE-SPECIFIC PROTECTIONS

Marriage-Specific bills create conscience protections related to the legal versus theological definitions of marriage.

CAMPUS RELIGIOUS FREEDOM

Campus bills protect students, professors, and speakers, covering religious speech and the autonomy of faithbased clubs.

K-12 RELIGIOUS FREEDOM

K-12 bills generally cover religious holidays, student prayers, and speech.

MEDICAL

This category covers bills related to healthcare and conscience protections for healthcare workers.

ADOPTION

These bills safeguard the conscience rights of faith-based adoption and/or foster-care providers.

OTHER

This catch-all category includes narrowly-focused bills such as those addressing religiously-objecting hunters, religious garb in the workplace, and the employment of minors by religious organizations.
